We present you the next edition of our newsletter, wherein we feel proud and exuberant to unravel and share some of those unforgettable and precious moments.








# GURU PURNIMA AND WORLD POPULATION DAY ASSEMBLY

# THE FRENCH ASSEMBLY


The French Assembly or we must christen it as Event Extravaganza, is one of the most-awaited assemblies in the whole year.

# KARGIL VIJAY DIWAS DAY









# ASSEMBLY ON RAKSHA BANDHAN



# JANAMASHTMI






# DIWALI ASSEMBLY

# 2D DESIGN MAKING USING MATHEMATICAL SHAPES









# HINDI CALLIGRAPHY ACTIVITY






# ARTICLE WRITING ACTIVITY




# INDEPENDENCE DAY


# STORY TELLING ACTIVITY






# ENGLISH CALLIGRAPHY ACTIVITY



The beautiful smiles and their enthusiasm said it all. There was merriment, excitement and celebration all around.








# GOOD TOUCH AND BAD TOUCH
