‘The greatest gift you can give your family and the world is a healthy you.....’

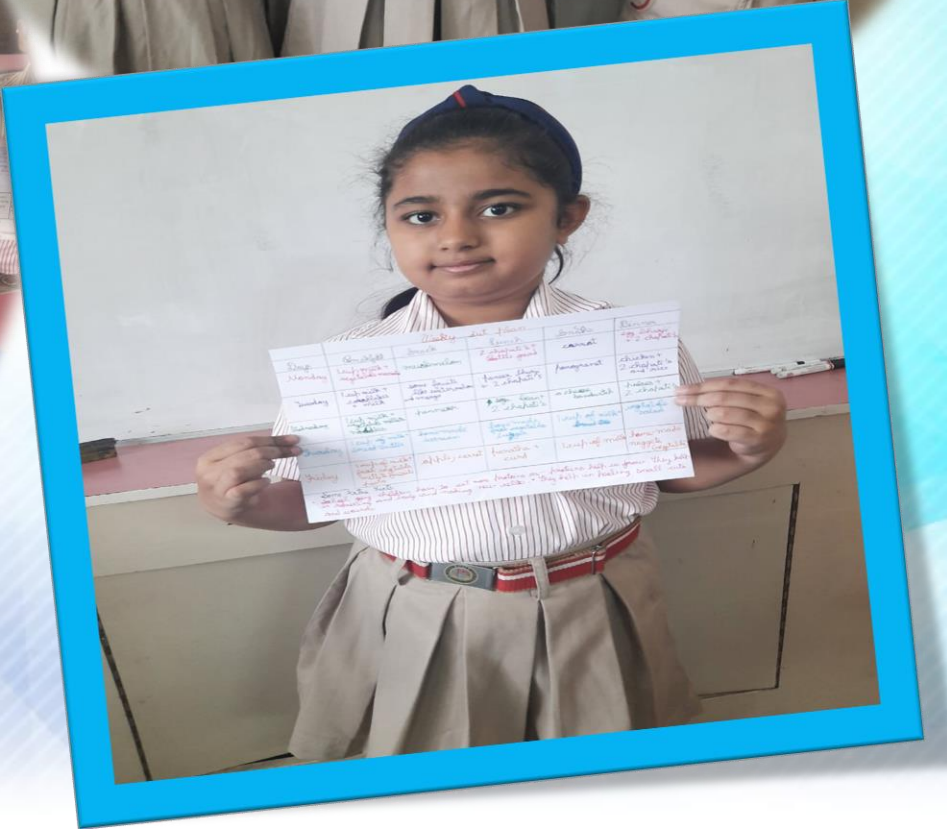
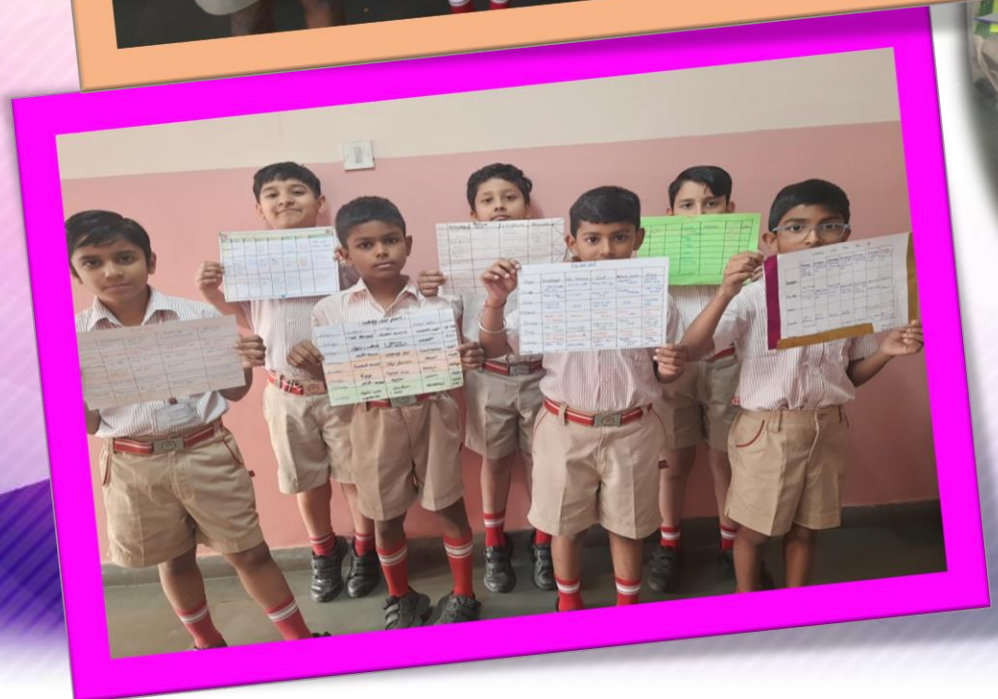

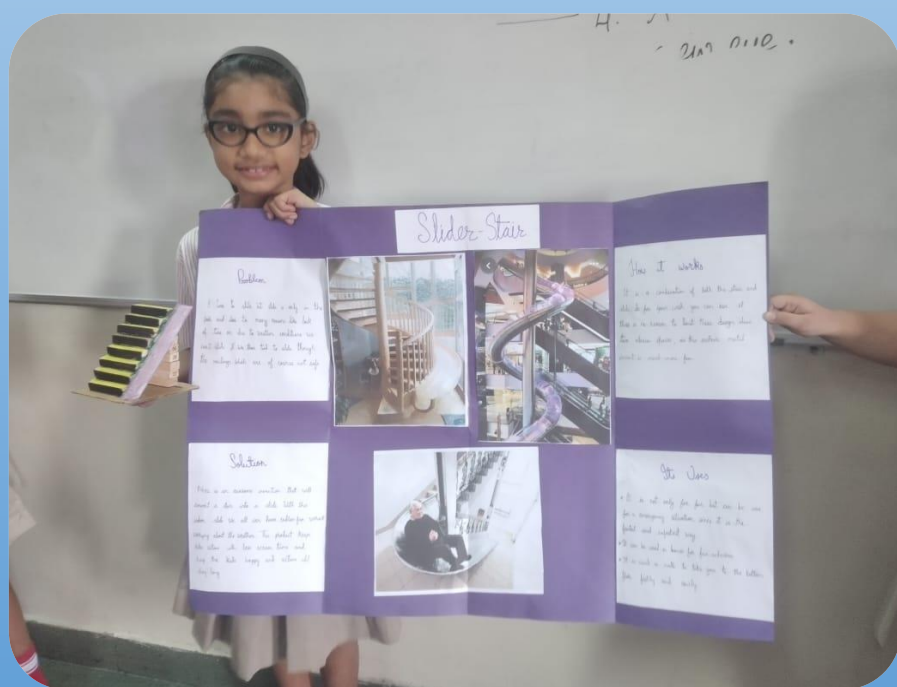










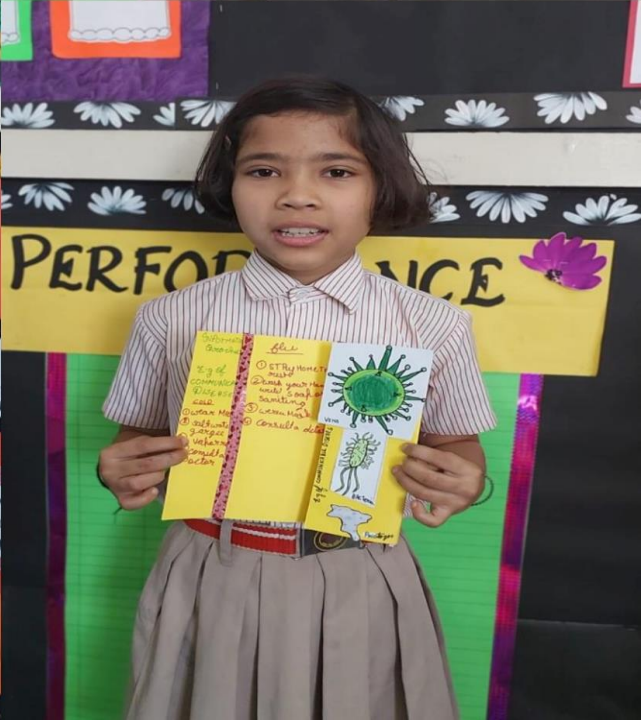
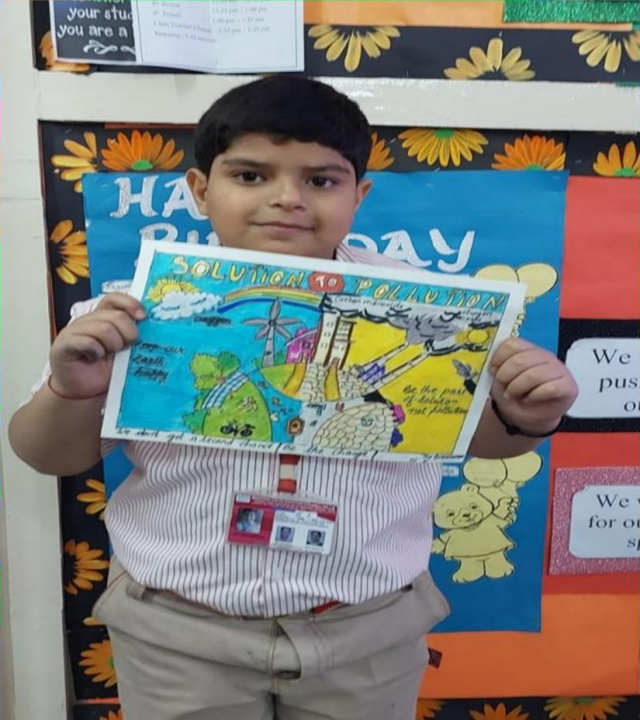
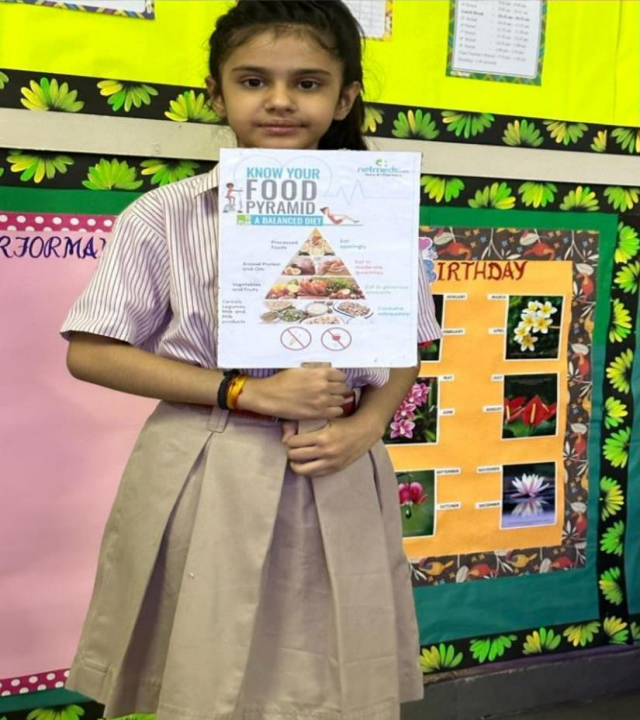


# SCIENCE MONTH-APRIL

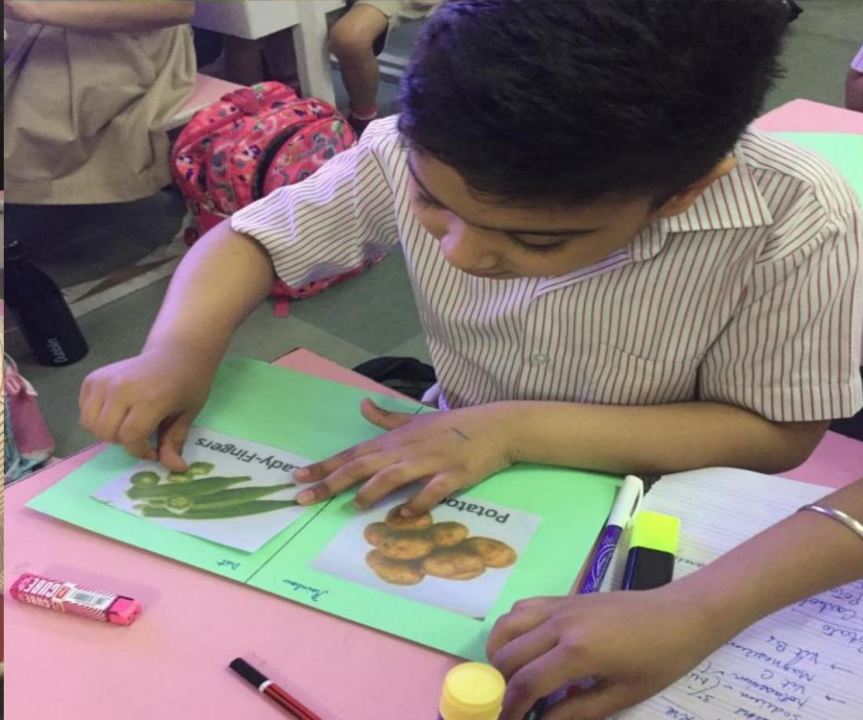
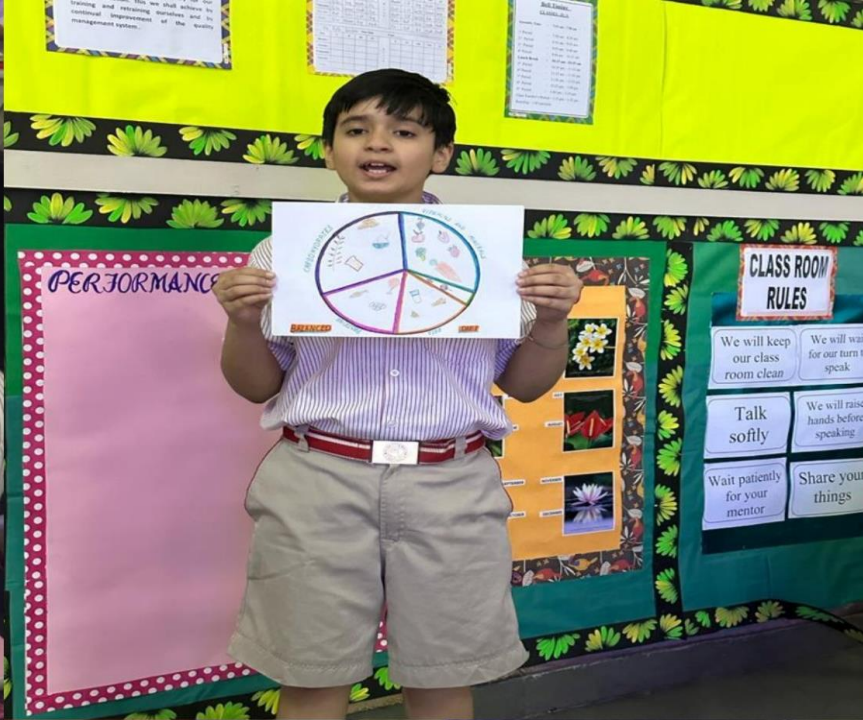

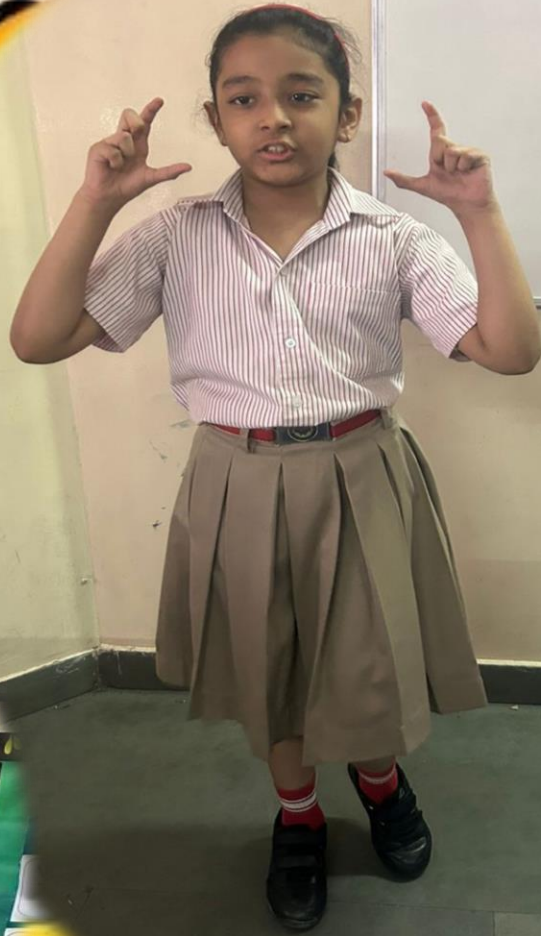


# WORLD LAUGHTER DAY

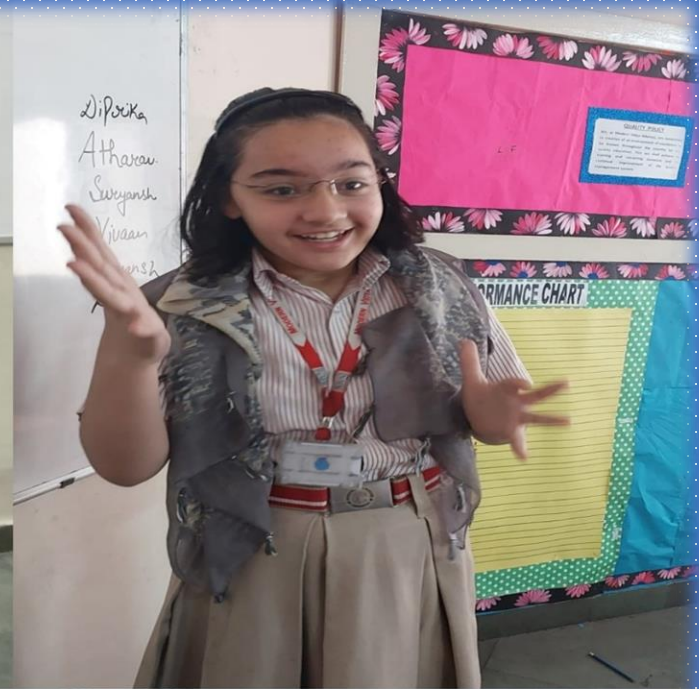
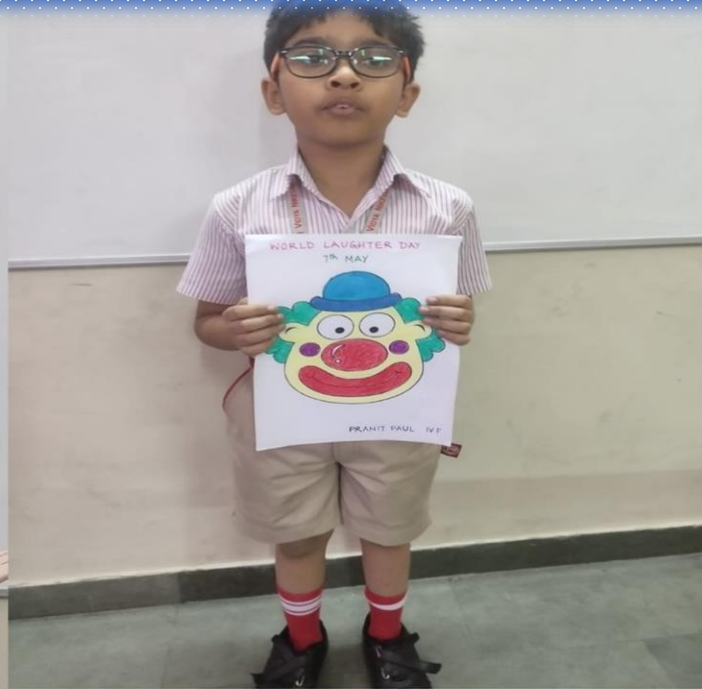

Laughter is the best medicine, and it keeps our mind and heart cheerful. So we must laugh whenever we can.







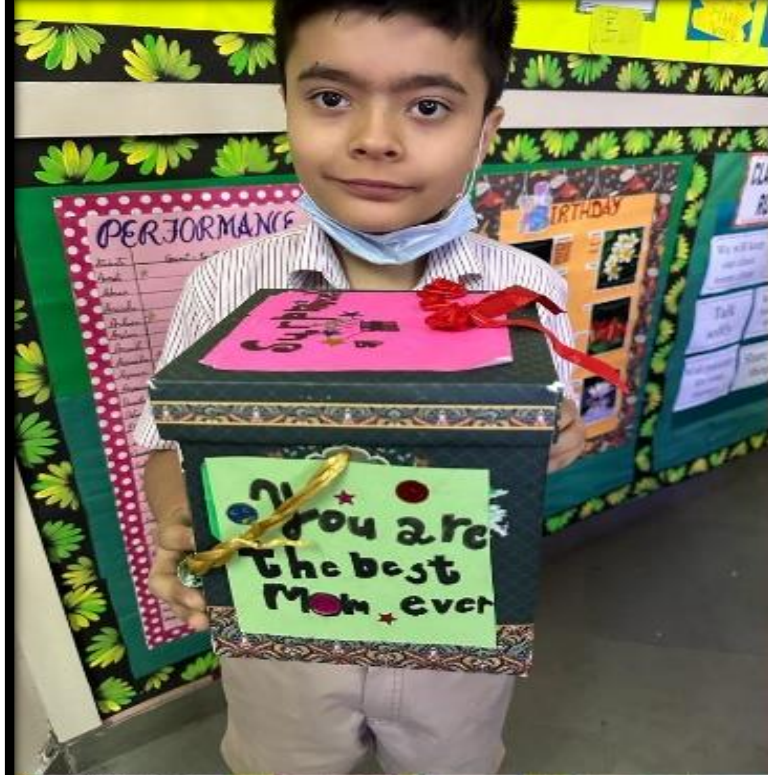
# MOTHER'S DAY ACTIVITY

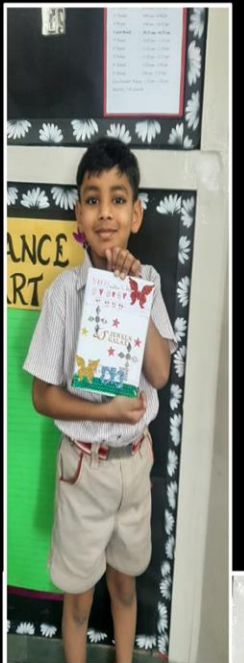

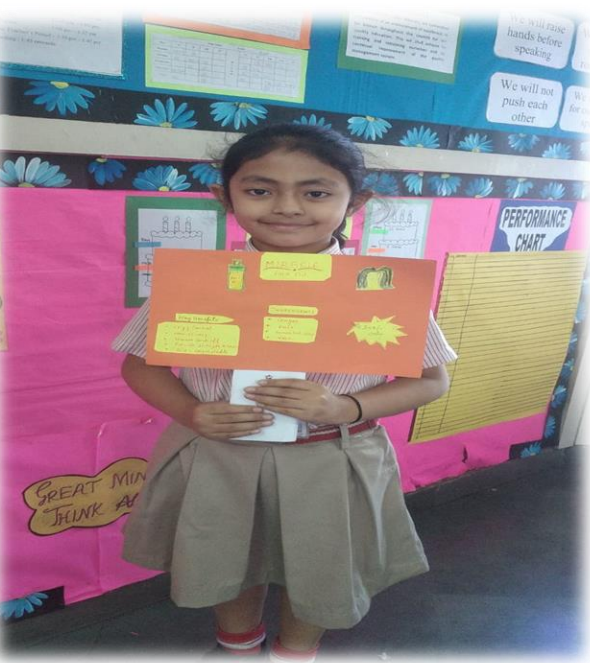


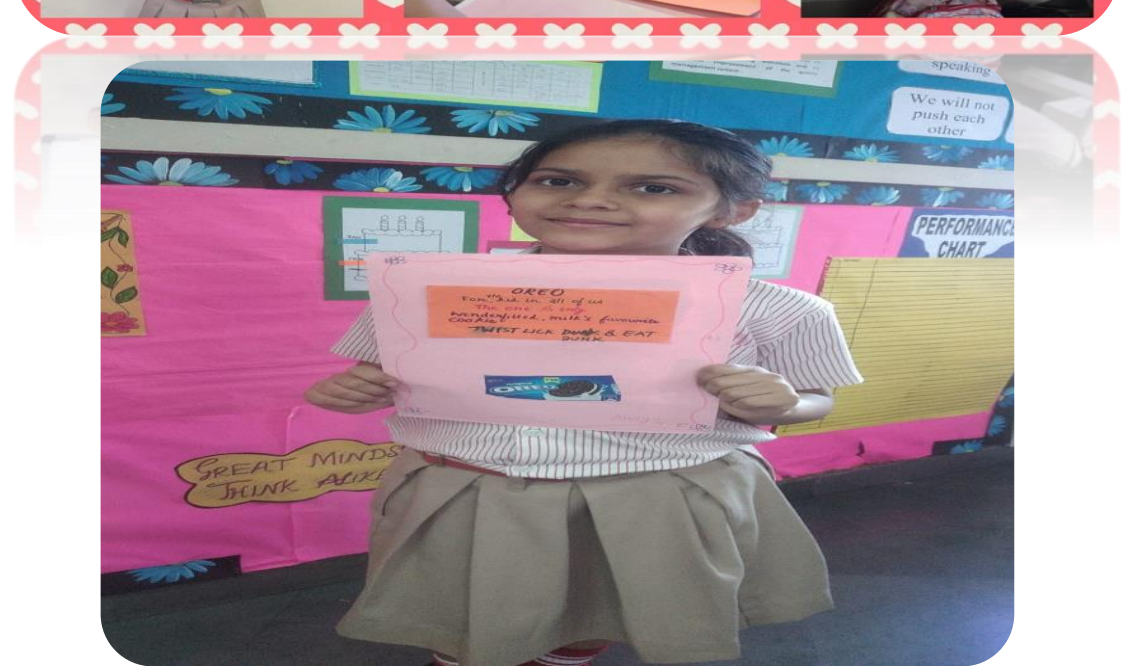


# ENGLISH MONTH - MAY

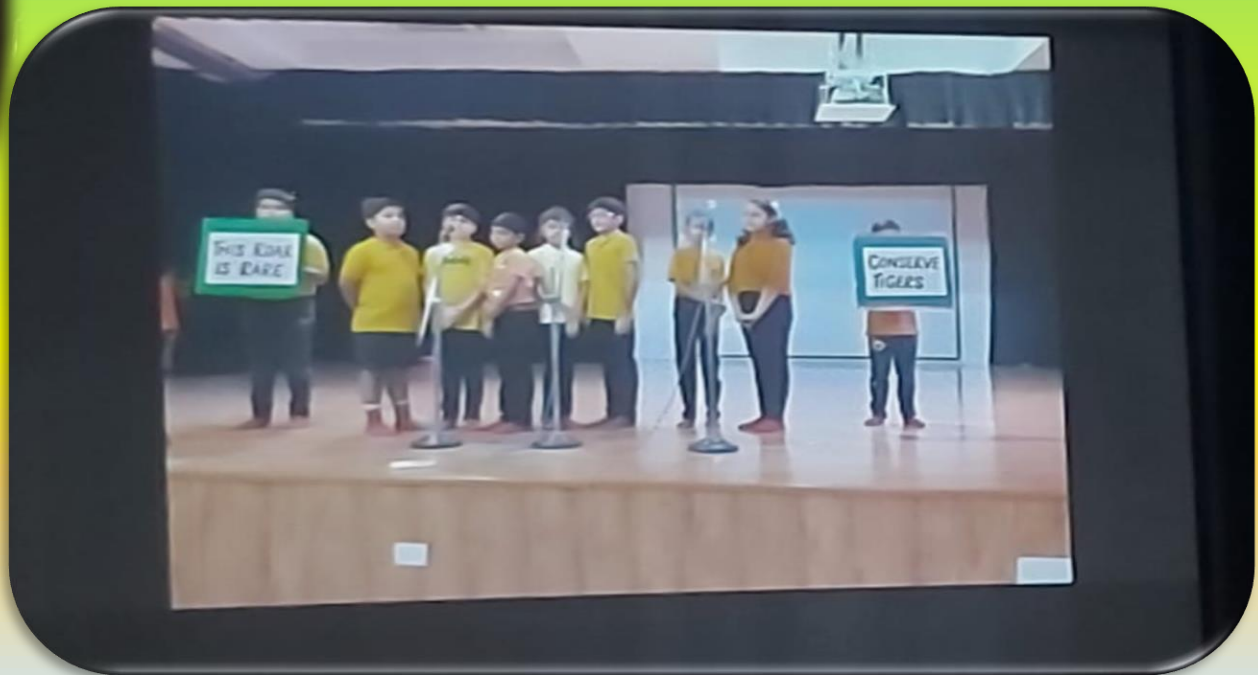
# WELCOMING ASSEMBLY

Besides Earth Day, the students also celebrated Baisakhi. The students gave a colourful glimpse of Baisakhi by performing dance to the fast beats of drum and music.





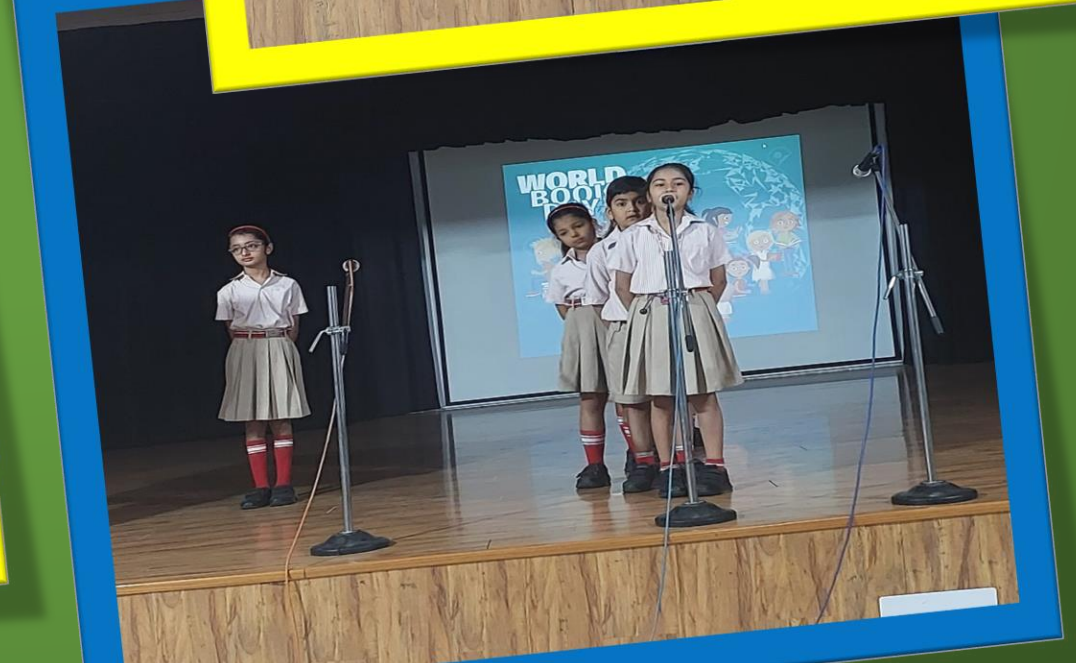


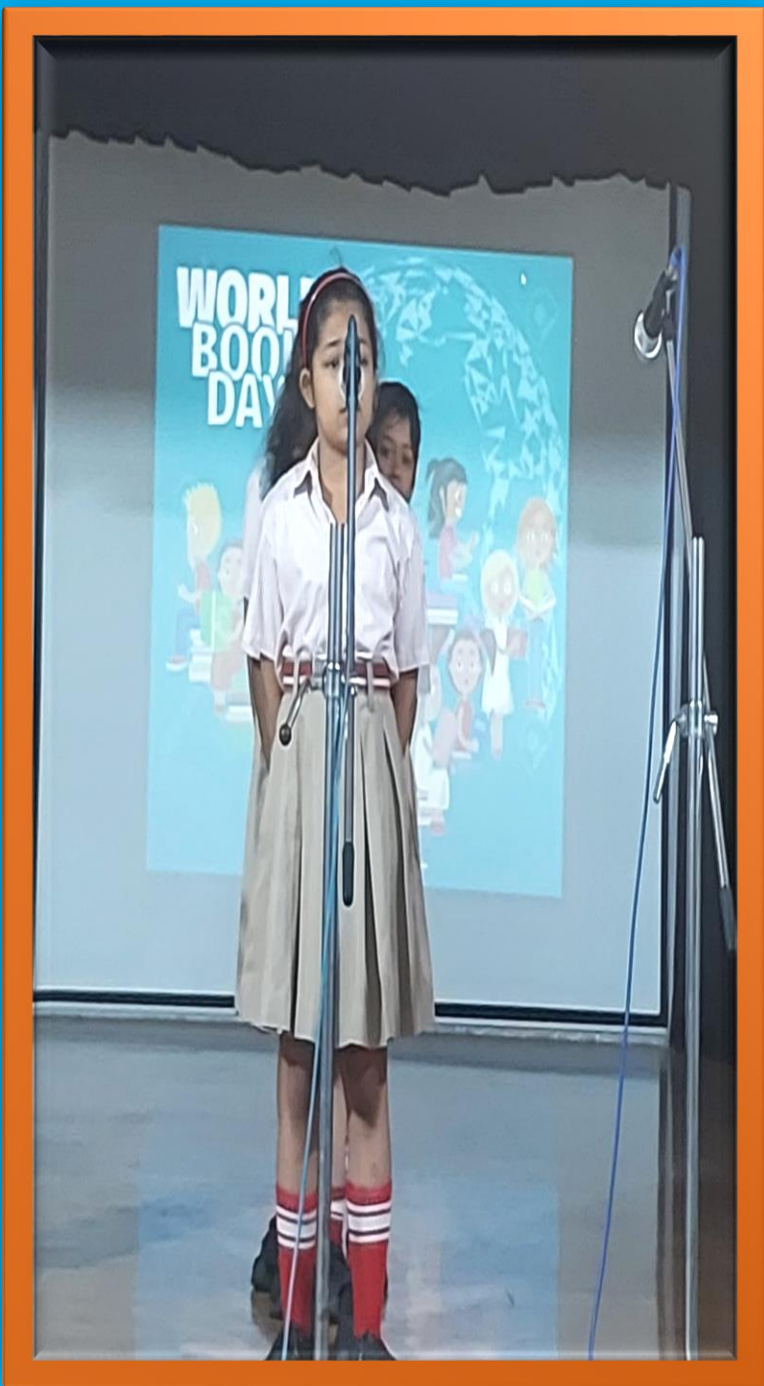
# HAPPY WORLD BOOK DAY

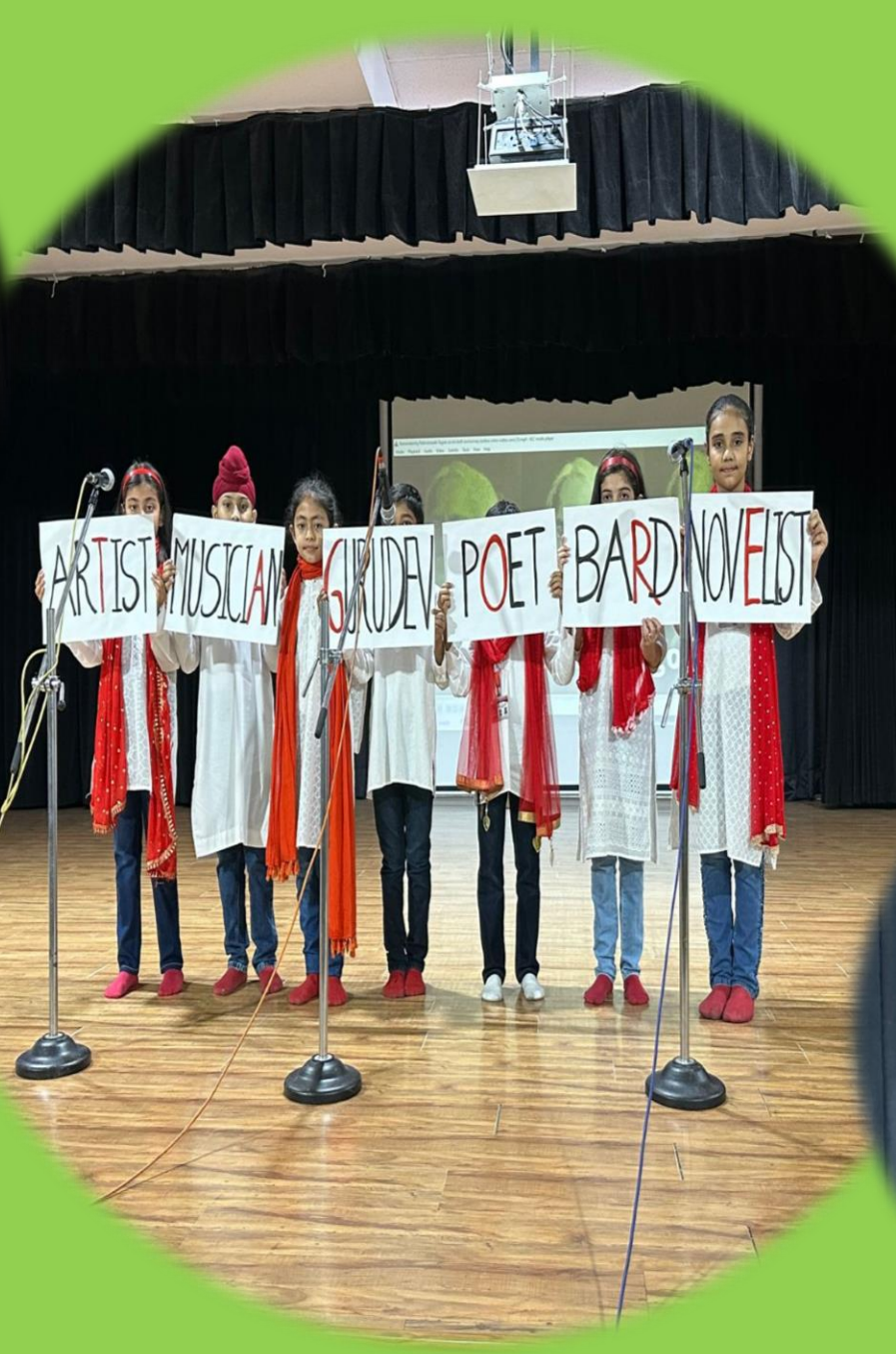




# RABINDRA JAYANTI ASSEMBLY

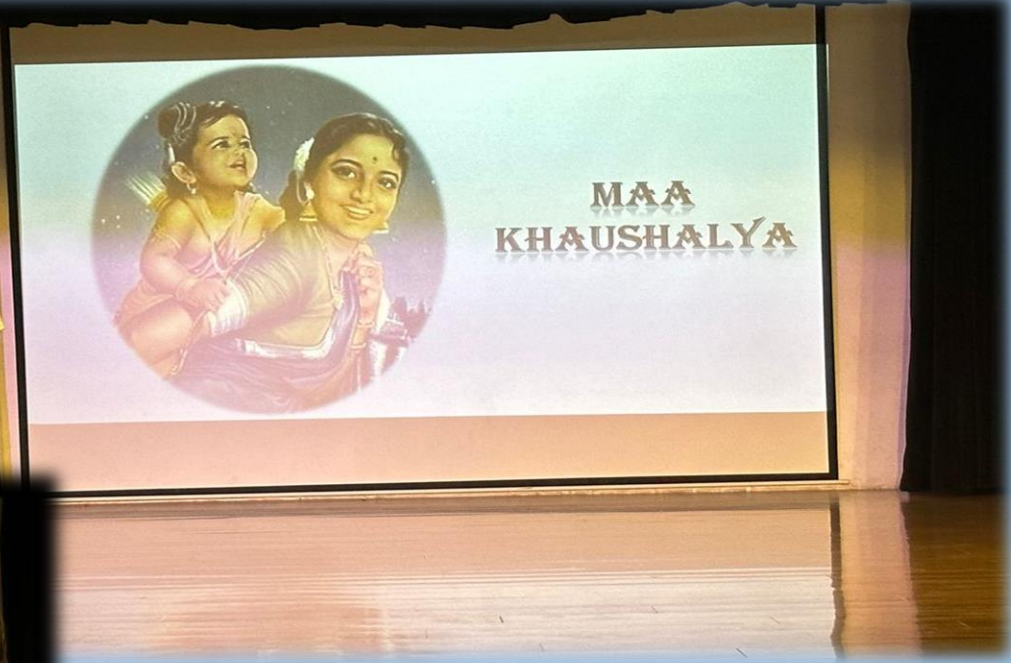


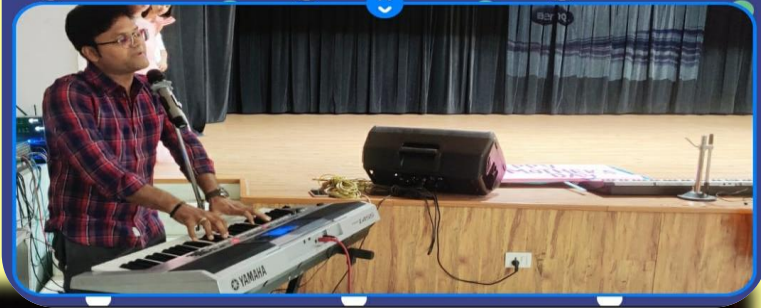
