
In the context of gratitude, the lotus could signify finding appreciation even through challenges, just as it finds beauty and growth in difficult environments.






CHILDREN'S DAY






HAPPY GURPURAB





At School

Teaching personal safety in a simple, clear and supportive way helps children become confident. The session was made interesting by using interactive Videos and storytelling. The "Stranger Danger" concept was elaborated by our school counsellor, Ms. Rakhi Yadav, where children were explained that not everyone they meet is a friend and they should never go anywhere with people not known to them. They were encouraged to tell their trusted adult if they felt uncomfortable about any situation. The children enjoyed the workshop and came up with good answers when asked about their learnings from the session.
