
# *Monologue Activity*

# *Rangoli Making Competition*





# *Carol Singing*







# *Calendar Making Activity*






“Those who have the knowledge of Dharma often say that truth is the highest Dharma”




# Navratri Assembly




*“There is a strong woman behind every successful man.”*






