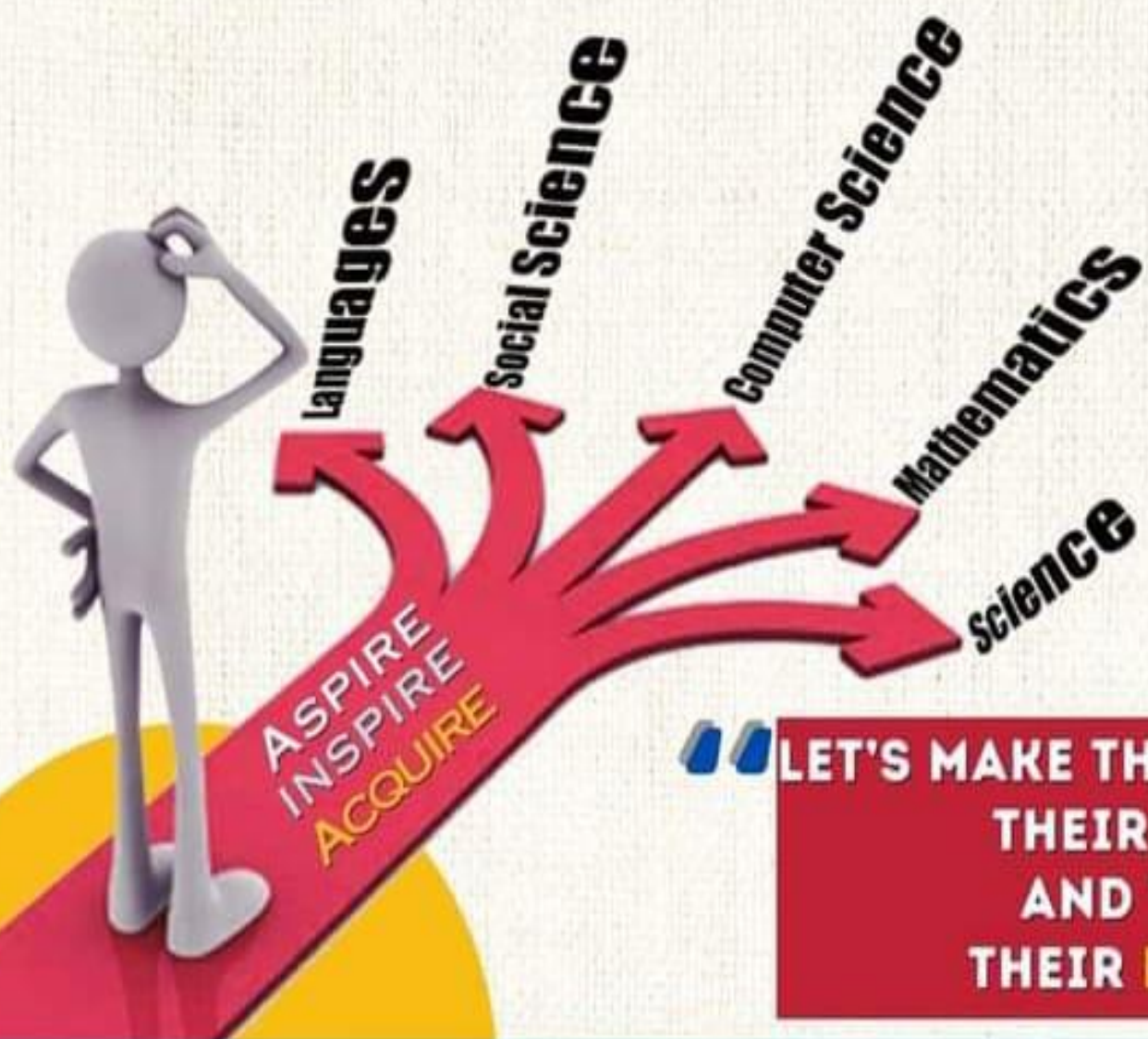
STUDENT ORIENTED CAREER PROGRAMME

Weaving Stories Together



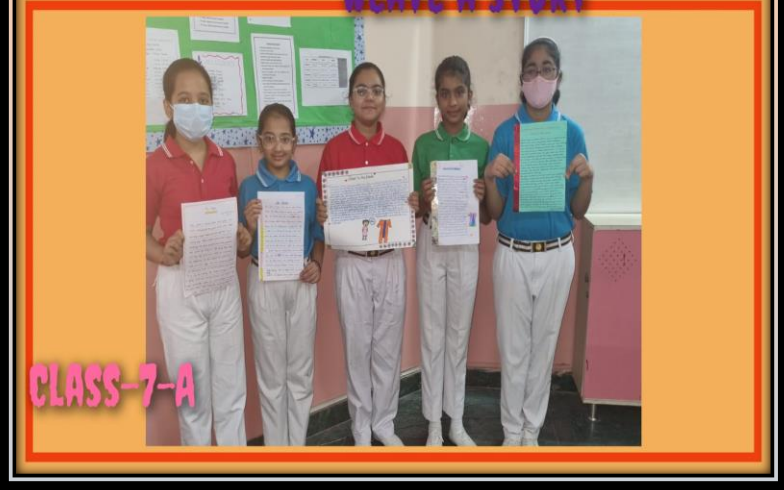
Richard Bach once said, "A professional writer is an amateur who did not quit."
