A few tips that can be advised are:

- Keep a tab on your child's online accounts. It might irk them initially but make them understand that monitoring their online activity would help them stay protected from cyber bullying.
- You can ask them in a friendly gesture about the people they are friends with online. Showing genuine interest will help them feel comfortable talking about it. Explain that it's easy for someone on the Internet to pretend to be someone they're not.
- Explain how information and photos found on the internet can resurface years later. Explain how auto-correct can sometimes result in misunderstandings and hurt feelings.
- Discuss the importance of having healthy and safe relationships with them.
