Diwali Special Assembly



“The real essence of Diwali lies not in lighting lamps outside, but in dispelling the darkness within.”




MATHEMATICS ACTIVITY

BRITISH COUNCIL



The Learning Sector Programme of the British Council stands as a luminous bridge between cultures, classrooms, and continents—an enduring testament to the power of education to transcend borders. Rooted in the values of equity, innovation, and international understanding, the programme gently yet firmly reshapes learning landscapes, nurturing minds that are both locally grounded and globally awakened. MVN Aravali Hills supported and became a part of the Learning Sector Programme which aimed at STEM learning and enhancing capacities of students in Science and Technology. We got a STEM Challenge from our foreign partner, Ellesmere Port Catholic High School in U.K. Our cohort was Ms. Emily Dunn and the challenge given to the group was ‘How to improve the Biodiversity of their school since they have more Built up Area.’ The Learners Cohort got the students together, gave the topic, researched on it, using STEM Skills, worked on a three-module system of Model, PPT and Movie Making. Our students did a resplendent job by researching the topic using AI expert as well as field experts starting from Science Mentors, Area Agricultural Scientists, Nursery Managers and gardener’s. They prepared the report with data from all sources and shared it with the programme incharges who further gave their inputs. The four webinars for the teachers were collaborative, interactive and resourceful and on 12th December 2025, we presented a one slide presentation to elaborate our journey through this. Moreover, the British Council’s global perspective instilled in students a spirit of international mindedness, broadening horizons and nurturing respect for diverse ideas and cultures. The STEM Challenge became a canvas upon which innovation meets empathy and knowledge harmonises with responsibility. Ultimately, this initiative ignited collaboration across borders and ignited aspiration. It prepared students to become thoughtful innovators, ethical leaders and lifelong learners, equipped to contribute meaningfully to the learning sector and to the world beyond.





SIGNATURE CLUBS

The Signature Clubs of Class VIII conducted a series of thoughtfully designed activities on 20th November 2025, aimed at enriching student learning beyond the classroom. Each club offered unique opportunities for students to explore new concepts, collaborate with peers and apply their skills in creative and meaningful ways. In the Curiosity Club, students participated in the activity “Doctor in the Kitchen,” where they researched and presented the health benefits of common kitchen ingredients using well-designed charts and visual samples. The Code Crusaders Club introduced learners to the concept of loops in Python programming, enabling them to work with the for loop, the range() function, and various pattern-based tasks that enhanced their computational thinking. The Ink-and-Lens Club engaged students in “Emotions in Design,” a creative lettering activity that encouraged them to visually represent meaningful emotion-based words through colour, form and design. Meanwhile, the Sustainability Club focused on building environmental awareness through research presentations, poster-making and expressive performances on the theme ‘Climate Change’. The Impact Club conducted a structured “Word Power” vocabulary-building activity in which teams generated category-based word lists within a time limit, promoting linguistic fluency and teamwork. The Pi-rate Club offered an interactive Mathematics Morse Code Challenge, where students solved problems, decoded letters and uncovered a secret word, strengthening logical reasoning and collaborative problem-solving. Collectively, the Signature Club activities provided Class VIII students with holistic, multidisciplinary learning experiences that nurtured creativity, critical thinking and confident expression..

ANTI - BULLYING
