


Dear Parent,

Children should not just be punished for any wrongdoing but should also be made to think about the ramifications of their actions. Explain that there is a consequence for everything and everyone needs to think about the consequences first before acting.

4. Discipline starts with self. As a parent, you are the role model by default. Have a close look of your priorities and preferences to set an example for your child.

Students of Grade V exhibited their creative self and plated like an artist during the Salad Dressing Competition.






