






















MAGIC OF SCIENCE


















YOUNG EXPLORER SERIES



RAMANUJAN CLUB







SUNDAR PICHAI CLUB




















WELLNESS CLUB

In MF Hussain club students of Grade IV and V learnt how to make Tree without using pencil. They used different colours for blending.






Arts and craft activities help instill a sense of achievement and pride in children, boosting their self- confidence.


