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





TEACHERS' DAY


The students came together today to celebrate and honour the guiding lights of social framework —Teachers, through a vibrant and heartfelt assembly.


MOBILE ADDICTION & DIGITAL DETOX


LA SEMAINE FRANÇAISE: CELEBRATING CULTURE, CUISINE AND CREATIVITY

CLASSES IX&X


" True patriotism is rooted in understanding our society — its struggles, strengths, and stories. That's the power of social science."

SANSKRIT DAY CELEBRATION




DOCTOR'S DAY

STOP! THINK! BREATHE! SIMPLE TOOLS TO TAME YOUR TEMPER ANGER MANAGEMENT

“You don’t have to control your emotions; you just have to stop letting them control you.”

Our school counsellor Ms.Sreshti Chaturvedi conducted an enriching workshop on Anger Management for the students of Classes VI and VII, focusing on helping them understand and manage anger in a positive and healthy way.

The session introduced students to practical tools and techniques to manage anger, including: CBT (Cognitive Behavioural Therapy) techniques to help them pause, think and choose better responses. The Hand Model of the Brain, a fun and visual way to understand how our “Guard Dog” (amygdala) can take over, and how the “Wise Owl” (prefrontal cortex) helps us calm down and make better choices. Breathing exercises and self-talk strategies to manage overwhelming emotions.

A favourite part of the workshop was the Anger Iceberg Activity, where students wrote down the hidden feelings beneath their anger such as fear, embarrassment or sadness. This helped them realise that anger often masks deeper emotions that need care and understanding. The session encouraged self-awareness, emotional regulation and reflection, empowering our young learners to better understand themselves and express emotions more thoughtfully. A valuable life lesson they have learned that “It’s okay to feel angry, what matters is how we choose to respond.



PEER PRESSURE


Interactive Session for Empowering Students to Navigate Peer Pressure

EXAMINATION TIPS

“Exams are the opportunities to show what we have learned, not reasons to fear”.

To help students prepare for exams in a healthy and effective manner, the school counsellor, Ms. Sreshti Chaturvedi conducted an engaging workshop for Classes VI to VIII on the topic “Examination Tips” on 3rd Sep’25.

The session focused on three effective steps to exam readiness, that are Preparatory Skills, Acquisition Skills and Examination Skills. Under Preparatory Skills, students were guided on maintaining a regular sleep routine, eating nutritious meals, staying hydrated and setting up a clean, distraction-free study space to promote focus and energy.

As part of Acquisition Skills, the counsellor introduced smart and fun learning tools such as sticky notes, flowcharts, chunking techniques, mind maps and mnemonics to help students understand and retain information more effectively.

Moving to Examination Skills, the session focused on managing exam stress, emphasizing that feeling anxious is normal and can be handled with the right strategies. Students learned techniques like ‘Box Breathing’ to calm the mind, the ‘Worry Paper’ method to set aside anxious thoughts and positive ‘Self-Talk’ to turn self-doubt into confidence. They were also encouraged to take short breaks during study sessions to stay refreshed and alert. To make the session enjoyable and memorable, light-hearted videos were included to keep students engaged and lift their spirits. Students responded positively and shared that they felt more confident and less anxious about their upcoming exams. The workshop proved to be a valuable step in helping students build not only academic readiness but also emotional resilience, the skills that will support them well beyond the exam room.



SELF - ESTEEM

CLASSES VI & VII

The School Counsellor, Ms. Sreshti Chaturvedi conducted a workshop for Classes VI and VII on the theme “Empower from Within: Growing Self-Esteem Step by Step”. The session focused on helping students to understand the meaning of self-esteem, self-worth, body image and how these influence the way they think and feel about themselves. Through an open and age-appropriate discussion, students reflected on the importance of valuing their inner strengths rather than comparing themselves with others.

The counsellor guided students to recognize how thoughts can impact emotions and behaviour, encouraging them to develop a healthier and kinder outlook towards themselves. The discussion emphasized that true confidence comes from appreciating one’s abilities and uniqueness. By the end of the session, students carried the message with them that self-worth is not defined by appearance but by self-belief, kindness and respect for oneself.

- * Seeking help from trusted elders for guidance


