# VANMAHOTSAV CELEBRATION



“Each tree is a life. Let’s nurture it.”


## SPEAK ON SESSION


At MVN, we believe in nurturing self-expression and encouraging bold ideas—and this activity was a perfect example of learning beyond books.

## WORKSHOP ON CLEANLINESS

With this timeless quote, the school counsellor, Ms. Sreshti Chaturvedi, began an engaging and interactive workshop on Personal Hygiene for our pre-primary students. The session was designed to instill healthy habits from an early age and to make children aware of the importance of staying clean and healthy in their daily lives.

The workshop began with a warm interaction where students were asked simple questions about their daily routines, such as brushing teeth, bathing and washing hands, to help them relate personally to the topic. To make learning more visual and fun, the counsellor showcased a variety of daily-use essentials such as a toothbrush, soap, towel, nail cutter, comb and handkerchief. The children were encouraged to identify and name each item and share how they used it in their routine.

Through props and child-friendly language, the counsellor made the session lively and educational. The young learners left the session with smiles on their faces and a new awareness of how small daily habits could make a big difference to their health and well-being.



# BEWARE AND BE AWARE WORKSHOP

‘Safety doesn’t happen by Accident; it begins with Awareness.’

Keeping this in mind, the school counsellor, Ms. Sreshti Chaturvedi, conducted an engaging workshop titled ‘Beware and Be Aware’ for pre-primary students, focusing on the importance of personal safety in a child-friendly and age-appropriate manner.

At school, students were reminded to stay with teachers, walk in lines, and never wander off alone. Road safety was introduced with toy traffic lights and vehicles, highlighting the need to stop at signals and always hold an elder’s hand while crossing the road. For home safety, children learned not to touch sharp or electrical items, to stay away from fireworks, and to avoid opening doors to unknown people. One of the most important parts of the workshop was stranger safety, where the counsellor taught the children to say “No,” run away, and tell a trusted adult if they ever felt uncomfortable, which was reinforced through a lively role play.

The session ended with a cheerful safety song and a quick quiz to help reinforce what they had learned. The workshop was not just informative but empowering, helping our young learners understand how to stay safe and confident in different situations.



# ANIMAL EXPLORERS

It was a heartfelt celebration to thank the first and forever friends in their lives – their parents!




# 50 DAYS CELEBRATION

To promote a nurturing and positive learning environment, our school counsellor Ms. Sreshti Chaturvedi recently conducted an engaging workshop for Pre-Primary Students on the topic "Following Rules: Creating a Positive Environment Together." The session aimed at helping young children understand the importance of rules not just in the classroom, but in daily life.

Using stories, colourful visuals and interactive role-plays, the counsellor introduced the concept of rules in a fun and age-appropriate way. Children explored why we have rules like raising hands, using kind words, waiting for turns, keeping hands to themselves and how following them keeps everyone safe, happy and included.



# TIGER DAY

To introduce the letter T, our little learners celebrated Tiger Day. They enjoyed a takeaway of a Tiger Hand Puppet and learned the important message that we should not harm animals and must make efforts to protect tigers. Children also watched an informative story on Tiger Day, understanding how to protect tigers and preserve nature.

Further, they were introduced to T for Trunk, where they made an elephant's trunk using their hands and learned that "trunk" begins with the letter T. They also practiced tracing the letter T, which helped them in letter recognition and formation.

This activity beautifully integrated various Cambridge curriculum areas:

**Communication, Language and Literacy (CLL):** Recognizing the sound of letter T through words like Tiger and Trunk, and tracing the letter T to develop letter-sound association and writing readiness.

**Understanding the World (UW):** Learning about tigers, animal protection and nature conservation.

**Personal, Social and Emotional Development (PSED):** Building empathy towards animals and developing responsible behavior.

**Creative Expression (CE):** Crafting Tiger Hand Puppets and using actions to form an elephant's trunk.



# TIGER DAY

At MVN Kindergarten, our UKG learners celebrated International Tiger Day with boundless excitement! Each child crafted their own vibrant tiger mask—striped with bright orange and black, complete with eager ears and spirited eyes. Wearing their creative masterpieces, they paraded through the classroom with playful roars, their faces glowing with pride and curiosity.

**International Tiger Day** is observed every year on July 29th, introduced in 2010 during the Saint Petersburg Tiger Summit to promote global tiger conservation, protect natural habitats and raise public awareness about the threats tigers face, such as habitat loss and poaching etc. We told them that a future with tigers is essential for keeping forests healthy and ecosystems balanced. It was truly delightful to see our little ones expressing their love and gratitude through smiles, hugs and captured memories.




# GRANDPARENTS' DAY




