COLLAGE MAKING










AKSHAY URJA DIWAS






EXPRESSIONS OF GRATITUDE






BANNER MAKING

UNITY IN RELIGION


'We are only as strong as we are united, as weak as we are divided.'




BIO-SKETCH

West Bengal Kolkata.

Born in a family of 14 children in Cuttack (presently in Odisha) in erstwhile Bengal Province, British India, Netaji grew up to become a noted
freedom fighter of international distinction.

Netaji's slogans: Tum mujihe khoon do, main tumhe azadi dunga'
(Give me blood, and I shall give you freedom)
were also given by Netaji. Furthermore, the iconic freedom fighter was
the one who chose Jana Gana Mana, written by Robindranath Tagore,
as his preferred national anthem for independent India.

Netaji's A bright student. Netaji seured second and fourth position in
his matriculation and Indian Cryl Services (10%) seamination essectively. He. Rowewer, resigned from the ICS job as he didn't wish to serve
British govt and Bose: The iconic freedom fighter, known for his intitancy approach for liberating India, was arrested, released and rearrested countless times as the British government suspected him of
being involved in secret evenoulinonry activities.

Netaji's Azad Hind Fauzz: Commanded by Netaji, soldiers of the Indian
National Army (INA), also known as the Azad Hind Fauzz glaintly
fought for an undivided and independent India. They were
court-martialled and rised for treason by the British over 74 years
Netaji's disappearance: Netaji's death remains one of the biggest
Indian mysteries. He is soid to have died in a Japenese plane crash in
Tajiped on August 18, 1943. All as he came back as a Gummani Baba,
His Family and Friends believed that he was Netaji Becuse of his
confidencial facts. But this was confirmed by the Central government
in response to an RII (Right to Information) query in 2017 That
Various groups hove, however, refused the daim.
Since his disappearance, many conspiracy theories have surfaced.

Sir's vision continues to live on in each one of us as a guiding light even today.



'Self awareness doesn't stop you from making mistakes, it allows you to learn from them.'






THE POWER OF GOOD HABITS





